#### amanda ogilby

Margaret River artist Amanda Ogilby produces her still life works through a combination of passion and determination, while experiencing sensations of meditative calm and gratitude during the creative process. She pairs common, yet carefully curated household décor with assorted fruits, florals and fabrics. The results are elegantly adorned scenes that are as delicate as they are bold. Amanda got engaged in crafts and creative endeavours from an early age. Her parents were both creatively inclined, particularly her father who was a keen hobby artist and worked primarily with charcoal and pastels.

After her working career and birth of her two children, now grown, Amanda has reinvigorated her artistic zeal and freedom of creative expression, soon developing her paintings exclusively using her chosen medium of oils.

Amanda has twice been a previous finalist in the Lethbridge 20000 Small Scale Art Award and 2023 finalist in the Unearthed Art Prize. Amanda's art is exhibited in galleries nationwide.

#### daniela minns

Daniela Minns is a Sydney based artist who works primarily in acrylic, pastel, and collage.

In her previous career Daniela worked as a stylist and writer in magazines (before print was a dead media) and was then a successful e-commerce retailer for almost a decade. Creativity has always been at the heart of every pursuit Daniela has had professionally so it was no surprise to anyone when she picked up a paintbrush 10 years ago.

A self confessed bowerbird for sparkles, texture and vibrant colours; magenta pink and ultramarine blue are embedded in her core.

"Colour is at the heart of my life, my work, my inspiration. I love the way colour injects joy into every space and place.

My works are primarily abstract because I love to interpret what I see, feel and think onto the canvas in a way that only I see. Abstraction speaks to my soul in the same way because it is loose, wild and free and is not bound by reality".

"The brush takes me on an unknown journey every day in my studio.

I am infinitely inspired wherever I go and this means that my painting practice is always evolving. The constants however are always; colour, texture, movement and abstraction".

Works are held in private collections in Sydney, Melbourne, Adelaide, Noosa, and Internationally in London, New York, Toronto, Madrid and San Francisco.

I am a self-taught artist based in Adelaide, South Australia, working primarily in oils. Drawing and painting have been part of my life for as long as I can remember. Over the years, they've become a way for me to pause, reflect, and notice the quiet beauty in the world around me.

Much of my inspiration comes from time spent in nature: walking, observing, and capturing moments through photos or sketches. My paintings often begin loosely and gradually take shape as I refine them layer by layer. I'm especially drawn to the way light moves through the landscape. It shifts colours, deepens shadows, and softens the edges of things. These subtle changes are what I try to hold onto when I paint.

I hope my work offers a quiet moment, a chance to pause, reflect, and perhaps see something familiar a little differently.



With formal training in glassblowing, she explores the interplay of shape, light, and texture using bio-resin and silver. Through handmade reproduction techniques and mold-making, she creates limited edition production runs that blend craftsmanship with playfulness.

Her work celebrates imperfection, embracing organic forms and unique variations in materiality. Inspired by traditional glassblowing methods, she reinvents her early works in new materials, transforming imperfect or re-claimed objects into contemporary sculptural and functional works.



### linzie joanne


My artwork reflects the landscape where I live, driven by a natural desire to document the beauty and uniqueness of the land through painting. Mallee Scrub was inspired by a walk near the Fivebough Wetlands in the Riverina—a place that continues to shape my creative vision.

Through my work, I aim to capture the distinct forms and atmosphere of the Riverina landscape and share that appreciation with my viewers. My practice is deeply process-driven; I work primarily in the Alla Prima technique, allowing spontaneity and immediacy to guide the painting.

The landscape in my work acts as a metaphor for the human condition—its complexity, resilience, and vulnerability. I hope that the energy of my process is evident through the visible brushstrokes and the layered, merged paint, evoking both the physical texture of the land and the emotional depth it inspires.



#### heather cowie

My art and arts practice has always been embedded in the natural world and is a response to my past and present experiences in wild places. I am moved and inspired not only by the visual beauty and wonder of the forms which surround me but also by the dynamics and processes through which these forms have developed.

Fundamental to much of my work is the exploration of time and what happens through time. I am also fascinated by the traces which remain in the 'here and now' which hint at past events. As a geologist I was a 'reader' of the history of the earth in rocks, so as an artist I feel I am a 'writer' of the history of a painting. The colour-worlds which develop as I work are visual memories drawn from encounters with landscapes I have known.

My paintings consist of oil paint mixed with cold wax medium. I use a process dependent on layering and time - the paint is applied with a silicone scraper then left to 'set' until it is ready to take the next layer and so on. I often mark each layer in some way depending on where the painting to journeying towards. Lifting paint off is almost as important as laying it down as this allows for parts of the underpainting to be exposed. To do this I use various types of paper, each behaving slightly differently and dependant on the pressure I apply and the manner of my movements across the surface. This working 'blind' allows for instantaneous expressive markings which are more 'body' than 'mind' interactions. It is an exciting process of addition and subtraction, all the time building textures and form.

I don't paint paintings that look like 'real' places, they are ciphers and signings, symbolising an emotional connection to 'somewhere'. Any experience with the natural world touches us all and just the slightest juxtaposition of colour and form can act as a memory-trigger to places we have been. I want my paintings to evoke in my audience a deep respect for and connection with the multitudinous forms of which our planet is composed and to delight the eye, mind, senses and spirit with these expressions of the artistic world in which I inhabit and imagine.
